John & Dora Black Family

Boulder Country and It's People, LeNora LeFevre, p. 113

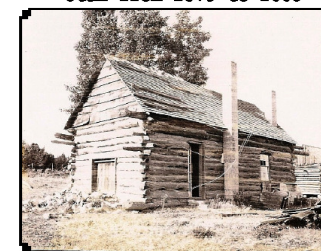
In 1904, Almon Robison sold his land, cattle and improvements to Joseph Robison and John Black. That fall Joseph sold his interest to John Black, his cows and calves selling for ten dollars a pair and left Boulder with Alfred Whatcott. It was past the middle of November when they closed the deal. Dora, John's wife, had been ready for days and was anxious to start their journey over the mountainous country they must travel before they reached Kanosh. The days were warm with clear blue skies throughout the month of October and so far, in November. It was a balmy day when the Blacks left the ranch in the loaded wagon with their four children Lasca, Leone, Orrin, and baby Stanford. John drove the team of four horses up the Haws road and would go by way of McGath Lake to the Boulder Swale across the country to Wayne County and from there to Kanosh. They camped the first night in the McGath cabin. Early the next morning they found the mountain covered with snow twenty-four inches deep with heavy clouds promising more. They hurried through breakfast and hastened on their way. Soon the horses were pulling the wagon through the deep snow over the first switchbacks. About halfway up the steep rocky road from McGath Lake to the Boulder Swale on the summit, the sweating horses stopped. Dora and the little children climbed out of the wagon to push on the wheels. Lasca and Leone pushed on the rear wheels, little Orrin trudged along behind while Dora with seven-month old Stanford under one arm pushed on the front wheel. Just as it rolled over an enormous rock, she slipped and fell in the path of the rear wheel which ran right over her. John was standing up whipping the horses. Lasca was screaming, "Papa." John never looked back, the horses were slipping and plunging up the slick rocky road while he kept them moving and never stopped until the road leveled out. There he pulled the team to a stop and went down the hill to where Dora and the baby were still lying in the snow. He helped them up and fortunately they were not hurt, just badly frightened. Big flakes of snow were softly falling again and they were all wringing wet. John helped his family into the wagon now that they were safely over their hazardous switchbacks. On they went through the silent forest. The air was warm but they felt pressed for time as the snow deepened. After several days, they reached Kanosh over the snow-packed road where once again they were warm and comfortable in their home.

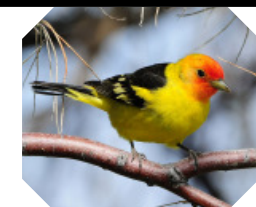
